***Pantheon Chemical's CEO Accepted Into 2006 Class  
For Birthing of Giants Program™***

Upon her completion of the program, Ms. Roberts will become part of an elite alumni group that includes: Thomas Golisano, founder of Paychex; Ted Leonsis, president of America Online; Jim Koch, founder of Boston Brewing Company; and Jim McCann, founder of 1-800-FLOWERS.

On her acceptance to the Birthing of Giants program, Ms. Roberts comments: "I am confident that I have the passion and vision to grow a successful business, but I also recognize I do not have the knowledge to take this company from 'good to great.'
