## 58 M-Pro 7 Gun Cleaner

For some hard-core shooters, there's nothing like the aroma of Hoppes #9. I've even heard guys joking about using it for cologne. While that might endear you to your buddies at the gun club, chances are your "significant other" doesn't share their taste in fragrances.

Years ago, when I was dating a young lady with severe allergies, virtually everything I used to clean guns would make her break out in a horrendous rash – all she had to do was walk into the room where I'd been cleaning guns.

Folks, I had a serious problem. It was either her or my gun habit and – at the time – I really would have missed her. Fortunately, after cleaning my guns in the far corner of the back yard for a while, I discovered M-Pro 7 Gun Cleaner. What initially attracted me to the product was that it is ODORLESS and NON TOXIC. I could once again clean my guns while sitting on the sofa watching the tube. (Yeah, I'd been single for a long time.)

Once, I even bought a case of government-surplus bore cleaner that was supposed to be the hot ticket for cleaning corrosive ammo. That stuff was NASTY – like nuclear-waste nasty. All of a sudden, the soap and water sounded much better.

But NOTHING is better than M-Pro 7 for cleaning up after black powder and corrosive ammo. The stuff just works and the mess is minimal. I no longer dread shooting my black-powder guns, because I can clean them in less than half the time it used to take me. The same goes for all my guns. Cleaning up after a day at the range is no big deal. To me the ultimate benefit of M-Pro 7 is that I get to spend less time cleaning and more time shooting.

Try M-Pro 7 once and you'll want to get rid of all your old stuff (make sure you use proper HAZMAT disposal protocol). I use it, I love it and I highly recommend it to anyone who likes to shoot. Who knows, it might even improve your social life – just ask my wife!
